What is the effect of facemasks on relational communication and empathy from a New Zealand Oncology Nurse perspective

I would like to take this opportunity to invite you to participate in a study that is exploring the experiences and perceptions of Oncology Nurses regarding communication and empathy who have been working while masks have been deemed mandatory in the workplace.

Who is the Researcher?

My name is Amanda Grant-Berkahn and I am a registered nurse who has been working in the Oncology sector for the past 10 years. I am completing this research project as part of a Massey University Master of Nursing degree. My supervisor is Philip Ferris-Day who is a lecturer at Massey University. As a nurse working in the current environment where masks continue to be used for prolonged periods, I have become very interested in how nurses feel that this may have affected their nursing practice regarding relational communication between colleagues and patients and the effect facemasks may have had on the demonstration of empathy in caring for oncology patients.

What is this research about?

Covid-19 has been with us since 2019 and while the mandated use of face masks has been stopped in most public places in New Zealand the health sector continues to use them to protect our vulnerable patients. While there is some research about the effects of facemasks on communication there is none that has focused on New Zealand oncology nurses making this an important phenomenon to investigate.



What type of participants are required?

Registered Nurses who have worked in the New Zealand Adult Oncology sector between 2019 and 2023 who have used facemasks continuously in the workplace.

How will recruitment take place?

Advertisements will be placed in professional social media with the potential for word of mouth from the advertisement to encourage participants. This a small study it will involve 4-6 participants. For those that are interested in participating in this study I invite you to contact me via e-mail, phone, or text message.

What would this involve if I choose to take part?

If you choose to take part in this study, you will need to read the information sheet and sign the consent form. There will be a loosely structured interview via a zoom meeting which will last for approximately 60 minutes. There may be a need for a further short interview to clarify anything that is said in the first interview. The interview will be recorded but you can decline to answer any questions or ask for the recorder to be turned off at any time. After the interview the recording will be transcribed to find the general themes that are present in all participant interviews which will then be collated and written up in a report. You are welcome to have a copy of the transcription of your interview. Your details will remain anonymous, and the data will be kept in a safe place with the recording deleted after transcription has occurred and the transcription destroyed after five years. Your name will not be used in the research report, and you will be invited to choose your own pseudonym if you wish.

Participation in this study is voluntary and as such you are under no obligation to accept this invitation. If you decide to participate you have the right to

- Decline to answer any question.
- Withdraw from the study at any time.
- Ask questions about the study at any time.
- Provide information on the understanding that your name will not be used.
- Be given access to a summary of the project findings after completion.



• Ask for the recorder to be turned off at any time.

Ethical Approval

This project has been evaluated by peer review and judged to be low risk. Consequently, it has not been reviewed by one of the University's Human Ethics Committees. The researcher named above are responsible for the ethical conduct of this research.
